Award

The yearly N.I.C.E. Award promotes innovations through culture and creative industries into the wider economy and society to tackle the major challenges of our future today. To this end, the N.I.C.E. Award creates visibility and know-how transfer for so far overseen innovations throughout Europe, kicks off debates and impulses in business, culture and policy alike and motivates cultural and creative makers to be innovative and more experimental.

The first N.I.C.E. Award 2013

served as a kick-off for N.I.C.E. during the 2nd Forum d'Avignon Ruhr. Teams formed by participants of the conference were given different topics to consider – and five hours to invent a spill-over idea related to Urban Development, Economy/New Work, Energy/Climate, or Intercultural Relations.

2014 when the network had grown and strengthened the very first call for the award was published which looked for cultural and creative projects generating spillover effects within a wide scope. 108 applications from 22 countries were submitted. The award was endowed with a total of 10.000 Euros. Ten projects shortlisted for the Award were presented in the first N.I.C.E. Exhibition.

2015 the N.I.C.E. Award continued to grow: on the topic "Save the world-major challenges" 213 projects from 29 countries were submitted. On total prize money of up to 20.000 Euros and 15 spots in the N.I.C.E. Exhibition were to be won.





The N.I.C.E. Exhibition was developed in 2014 parallel to the Award and since then it presents the projects nominated for the shortlist. Designed as a travelling exhibition it stops off in the different member states with the support of the N.I.C.E. Partners. A concept which makes the innovations from the Cultural and Creative Industries visible in a special way.

After its premiere in Essen the exhibition stopped off in Mannheim during the cultural festival "Nachtwandel" in autumn 2014, and in spring 2015 it was even an official item on the agenda at the well-known "Designmonat Graz."
